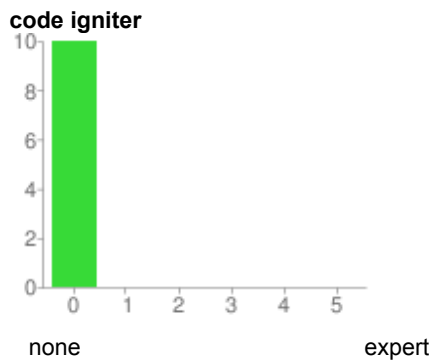
drupal expertise - comments
